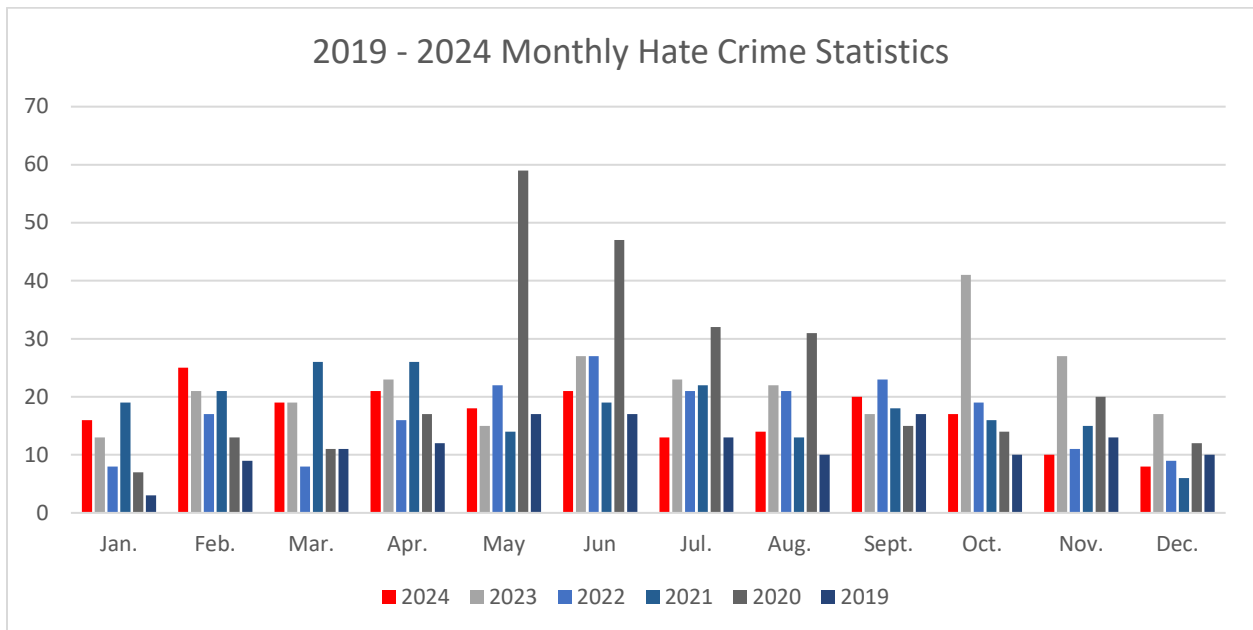


The following are reported incidents, which involved bias, prejudice, or hate-related themes between January 1st, 2019 to December 31st, 2024. These totals include hate crimes as well as other hate themed incidents (ie: incidents which may not meet the legal definition of a hate crime or criminal code offence yet are motivated by bias, prejudice, or hate).

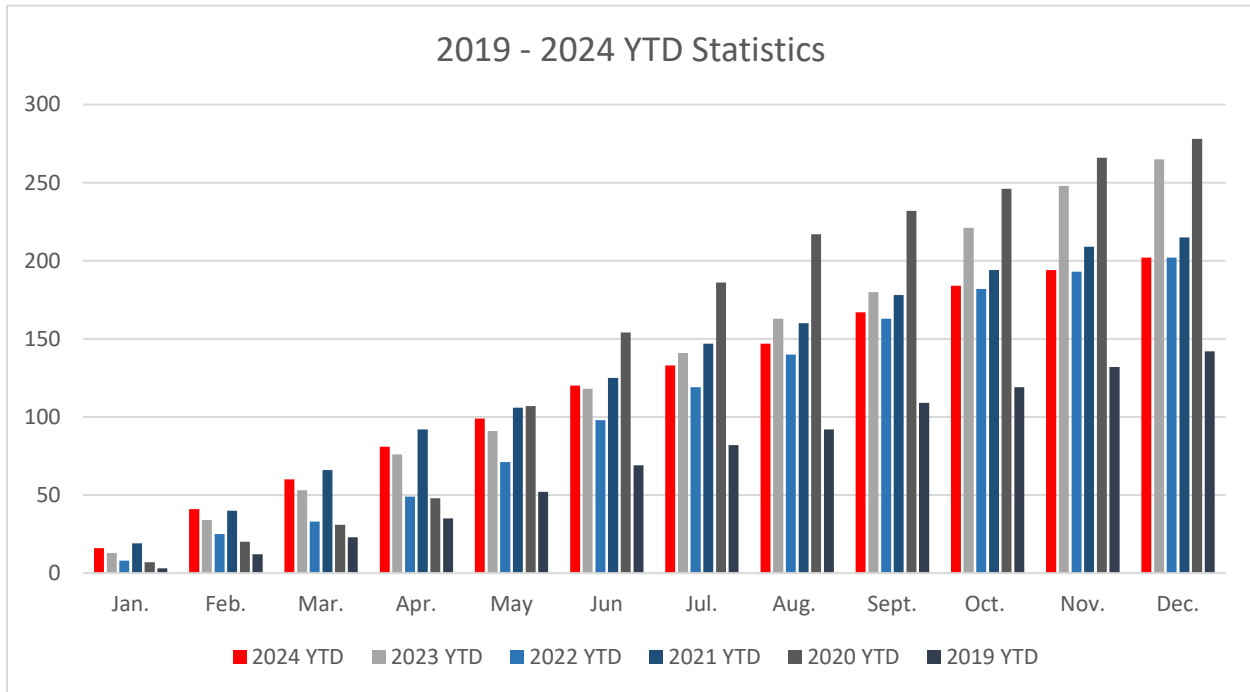
The incidents included are from a broad scope of hate crimes and/or hate themed events reported to the Vancouver Police Department. Incidents reported are subject to further investigation to determine if a hate crime occurred, and to determine further linkages to other incidents. The numbers provided may not be reflective of the count of incidents that Statistics Canada deems a ‘hate crime.’

Figures are subject to change due to data entry lag time and reporting delays.

Chart below is a monthly graph of reported incidents between the years 2019 to 2024.



The chart below depicts year-to-date reported incidents between the years 2019 to 2024.



Due to the high volume of reported incidents over a 5 year period, it would not be feasible to create a month-to-month by group chart. The table below is a yearly breakdown of reported incidents by groups affected.

Our Diversity, Community and Indigenous Relations Section (DCIRS) has provided the following additional information, which may be of assistance to you when reviewing this data.

- Hate crimes/incidents are under-reported. Many community members do not report incidents that are motivated by hate bias or prejudice. Reluctance to report impacts certain communities more than others and therefore hate crimes data is never completely reflective of what a given community may be experiencing on a day to day basis;
- DCIRS has worked hard to educate the community through in-person meetings and via social media on what hate crime / hate incident is and how to report. We have encouraged the reporting of hate motivated crimes and incidents;
- Hate Crimes data reflects membership to a given group, coding is dependent upon questions asked by police members or self-reporting by community. There are cases where an officer may not be certain of a person's cultural background and uncertain or reluctant to inquire for sensitivity reasons. Coding is open to human error;
- Hate Crimes files are reviewed by hate crimes investigators. While many files are reviewed, not all files are coded as being motivated by hate, bias or prejudice. Reviews are subjective and therefore statistics can be impacted by a subjective review;
- All numbers compiled are subject to change dependent on analysis completed by Quality Control. Quality Control reviews may be completed after month end reports are submitted. Late reviews or late submissions of files can impact statistical outcomes;
- Hate crimes data includes hate incidents, hate crimes and hate motivated crimes. This means that data includes hate incidents, such as racial slurs, hate crimes, such as criminal code offences linked to hate such as "willful promotion of hate" and "willful incitement of hatred", as well as hate motivated crimes, such as an assault that is proven to be motivated by hate. With this in mind, events can fall within a wide range of seriousness;
- Hate motivation types and community group categories are predetermined within the PRIME-BC system. These categories are informed by Statistics Canada criteria.
