We are replying to your request for information that was received on April 22, 2025. In that request, you sought access to:

- “Notes, documents, minutes, reports, presentation materials, plans and emails related to a meeting held with members of the Muslim community in early 2024 (January 1, 2024 to February 9, 2024) as referenced in this web posting by the Foundation for a Path Forward.
 - For emails, only seeking emails related to the planning of this meeting from December 1, 2024 to February 9, 2025, and from February 9, 2025 to April 19, 2025 for any post-meeting related emails”.

The date range for the email search was later corrected to December 1, 2023 to February 9, 2024, and February 9, 2024 to April 19, 2024.

Enclosed please find a copy of the requested records numbered 23 pages in total.

Information has been removed from the records in accordance with sections 15(1)(l) and 22(1) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (“the Act”). Excerpts of these provisions are attached. We can advise the withheld information relates to police-only contact information and the identifying information of third party individuals.



Disclosure harmful to law enforcement

- 15 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose information to an applicant if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to...(l) harm the security of any property or system, including a building, a vehicle, a computer system or a communications system.

Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (1) The head of a public body must refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant if the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.
