Re: Records Access Request

We are replying to your request for information that was received in our office on August 11, 2026. In that request, you sought access to information held by the Vancouver Police Department. Specifically, you wished to obtain:

"the number of police calls to First United (320 East Hastings Street) between December 2008 and January 2012. Can you provide the date for those calls as well as the general category of complaint/concern".

The requested data is attached.

Please note that calls for service data measures the demand for police services, not actual crime incidence. The initial call type may not reflect the final incident type following police attendance and investigation.

Please also note that police may not attend every call for service (e.g., some may be resolved over the telephone, some may be cancelled), and some calls may be linked to the location based on an involved party's address rather than where the incident occurred.

Under s. 52 of the Act, you may ask the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review our response to your request. You have thirty (30) days from the receipt of this letter to request a review by writing to:
